Regular member working sessions

The Hills Woodworkers will hold 'working' sessions on the to give all members an opportunity to:

- Work in a collaborative environment,
- Work on projects of their choice using Club tools,
- Enjoy the fellowship of working with other club members,
- Access expertise to resolve challenges available from other club members,
- Access Club resources, including project sheets and a library, for ideas and project details,
- Access Club equipment, such as the Sorby ProEdge sharpening system and/or the Club 8 inch grinder to sharpen chisels and other tools,
- Provide an opportunity for new members to practice and learn new skills, and
- Provide an opportunity for guests to come and see how we work (for up to two sessions).

Date: The first Saturday of each month, commencing 5 October 2024.

Time: The sessions will go from 10:00 am through to about 3:00pm (flexible). Lunch not provided.

Location: The sessions will be at the Laratinga Community Centre, 100 Springs Road, Mt Barker.

Cost: Members are expected to contribute \$5 to cover incidental costs, including tea and coffee.

Climate: Sessions will not be held if, on the day, the maximum temperature in Mt Barker is forecast to be 35 degrees or higher, OR if there is a 'Catastrophic' fire ban in place for Mt Barker.

Additional comments

These are to be member driven session, so we want comment and input to help make effective.

We do not expect a high level of expertise, as the objective is to give members an opportunity to develop their skills and ask questions. There will be some club members on hand to provide advice. However, we do expect that participants will have at least the basics and will have either completed an Introduction to Woodturning Workshop or have equivalent knowledge.

We are not providing blanks or other materials for projects.

We will make club tools (chisels etc) available for use. Members are also encouraged to bring their own tools to use.
